STORY DOOR SERVICE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The Michigan City Public Library is proud to provide free access to library materials for our homebound cardholders through our *Story Door* service. Once known as the *Homebound* program, the *Story Door* service has been part of our library for many years with recently included updates to make it an even more positive and enriching experience for our patrons. Library items can be sent to our adult and youth patrons who are temporarily or permanently unable to visit the library due to physical or mental health disability, vision impairment, illness, injury, or incapacitation. Delivery and return of materials is by the U.S. Postal Service and postage will be paid for both ways.

Attached is a *Story Door* application. If you do not currently have a Michigan City Public Library card, complete the enclosed library card application as well. Once the forms are completed and returned, we will set up a *Story Door* account for you. You will then begin receiving two items in the mail. Materials are due in 8 weeks. Late fees are .15 cents per item per day. A due date receipt will be enclosed with each package. You may certainly return items sooner in order to receive a new shipment as soon as possible.

When the items are ready to be returned, the return address card is to be turned over and inserted into the clear mailing pocket of the blue nylon bag in which they arrived. It can then be placed in your residential postal box. Instructions will be included in your first mailing.

Please review the following conditions:

- A parent or guardian with a youth Story Door patron under the age of 18 on their library card in clear status is responsible for any late, lost, or damaged item charges.
- Only movies from the Youth Services department can be checked out to those who
 are under the age of 18. All other material is able for borrowed regardless of age.
- A youth Story Door patron who is 16 years or older and would like to apply for their own library card must have a photo ID and proof of address to show Michigan City Library District residency. They will be responsible for any late, lost, or damaged item fees.
- Adult Story Door patrons are responsible for any late, lost, or damaged material charges.
- Story Door patrons are not allowed to participate in the program and visit the library to check out material under their library card since they receive the privilege of extended loan periods and benefit from postage paid both ways.
- Recently released items in our Display-A collection cannot be sent to Story Door
 patrons due to their popular demand and the checkout time being only one week
 for non-Story Door library patrons. We will make sure to note any requests for
 recently released material so that they can be received at a later date once
 placed in our regular library collection.
